Princeton Tops Harvard; Penn Wins 4th Straight

PRINCETON, N.J., Jan. 7 — The Princeton University basketball team demonstrated that it is still a power to be reckoned with in the Ivy League as it defeated Harvard, 83-64, tonight at Jadwin Gym.

Bob Kleinert led the Tigers, who improved their record in the Ivy League to 2-1, with 16 points. Princeton had been struggling after a loss to Penn earlier in the week.

The Crimson, 4-9 over all, who lost to Penn by 5 points last night, committed numerous turnovers as the Tiger defense prevented them from scoring during the first four minutes of the game. Princeton jumped out to a 15-2 lead and widened the margin to 42-25 at halftime.

Princeton penetrated the Harvard defense with crisp passing. Frank Sowinski and Kleinert of Princeton were often open for baseline jumpers.

Harvard, with its starting center, Brian Banks, back in Cambridge, Mass., studying for exams, was led by Gary Fine with 16 points.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 7 (AP)—James Salters and Tom Crowley sparked Penn to a 74-51 triumph over Dartmouth tonight.

With 12 minutes to go in the first half and Dartmouth leading, 17-15, Salters and Crowley, both reserve guards, entered the game. Salters made three straight field goals and Crowley added a basket and five assists as Penn rallied to take a 42-28 lead at halftime. Kevin McDonald scored 26 points for Penn.

The victory was the fourth straight

for Penn and lifted its season record to 6-3. Dartmouth is 0-8.

Duquesne 54, Penn State 48

STATE COLLEGE, Pa., Jan. 7 (AP)—Lonnie McClain scored 14 points and B.B. Flenory scored 12 to lead Duquesne to a 54-48 triumph over Penn State today.

Penn State made 23 turnovers while shooting 32 percent from the field. Duquesne committed 15 turnovers while making 33 percent of its shots. Duquesne was left with a 2-1 record in the Eastern 8 conference and 4-5 over all while Penn State dropped to 1-2 and 5-7.

Penn State lead throughout the first half and held a 27-23 advantage at halftime. Duquesne took a 42-40 lead on a layup by Flenory with eight minutes left.

Kentucky 86, Florida 67

GAINESVILLE, Fla., Jan. 7 (AP)—Kyle Macy scored 20 points for Kentucky, and the Wildcats used tenacious zone and man-to-man defenses to achieve an 86-67 victory over Florida in a Southeastern Conference game tonight.

The triumph improved Kentucky's won-lost record to 10-0 over all and 2-0 in the S.E.C. Florida fell to 8-4 and 1-2.

Macy scored 16 points in the first half to help put Kentucky in front, 38-31, at halftime. Florida closed within 3 points with 14:41 left in the game on a layup by Ric Clarson, who led the Gators with 17 points. Kentucky's Jack Givens and James Lee then began scoring. Givens had 19 points, all but 1 in the second half, and Lee scored 16.
