

Princeton Tops Seton Hall After a 31-Year Pause

SOUTH ORANGE, N.J., Jan. 10 — Princeton University took an early lead and went on to defeat Seton Hall University, 70-58, tonight in the first meeting between the state foes in 31 years.

Princeton shot 54 percent from the floor, with Frank Sowinski scoring 21 points and Bob Roma 18, to pace the attack. Randy Duffin had 16 points and Greg Tynes 15 for the Pirates.

Tynes scored a layup to give the Pirates their last lead, 8-7, with 14:45 left in the first half. The Tigers then went on a 14-4 spree, paced by three baskets by Bob Kleinert, and were never again in trouble. They led at the half, 36-24.

For Princeton it was the third straight victory for a 7-7 record while Seton Hall lost its third straight and now is at 6-6.

Penn 103, The Citadel 73

CHARLESTON, S.C., Jan. 10 (AP)— Scoring the first 13 points of the game, the University of Pennsylvania more than doubled The Citadel's score at halftime and went on for a 103-73 victory tonight. The Quakers' fifth straight victory raised the Ivy League leaders' record to 7-3. The Citadel, of the Southern Conference, lost its fourth straight and saw its won-lost mark fall to 5-7. Penn had a 51-25 lead at the half.

Rutgers 79, William and Mary 71

PISCATAWAY, N. J., Jan. 10 (AP)— James Bailey scored a career-high 43 points to lead Rutgers to a 79-71 victory over William and Mary at the Rutgers Athletic Center tonight. The 6-foot-9-inch junior connected on 17 of 24 shots from the floor and added nine free throws in helping the Scarlet Knights raise their record to 9-3. The

Indians, with 20 points from John Lowenhaupt, fell to the same record.

Bailey also collected 13 rebounds.

San Francisco 79, Notre Dame 70

OAKLAND, Calif., Jan. 10 (AP) — Doug Jemison led a 10-point spurt midway through the second half with three field goals to help San Francisco gain a 79-70 upset victory over fifth-ranked Notre Dame tonight.

Jemison's spurt capped a 16-2 run for the Dons that gave them a 63-50 lead, and they coasted from there.

The Dons (10-4), unranked this year, were led by Bill Cartwright's 20 points. Jemison had 14, Don Williams scored 17 for the Irish (7-3).

Rhode Island 78, Connecticut 68

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Jan. 10 (AP)— Led by Sly Williams's 23 points, Rhode Island beat Connecticut, 78-68, at the Civic Center tonight. Jim Abromaitas led Connecticut, now 6-6, with 19 points. Rhode Island has an 11-4 record.

Texas 100, Houston 89

HOUSTON, Jan. 10 (UPI)— Jim Krivacs, with 29 points, led Texas to a 100-89 Southwest Conference victory over Houston tonight. The Longhorns won with free throws, hitting 22 of 31.
