

Cornell 35, Penn 17

ITHACA, N.Y., Nov. 18 (UPI) — Joe Holland rushed for four touchdowns and 263 yards in his final college game today to help Cornell rally from a 10-point halftime deficit and defeat Penn, 35-17.

Holland, whose 1,396-yard season catapulted him from football obscurity to all-America candidacy, finished with 1,213 yards in Ivy League competition alone, becoming only the second back to break the 1,000-yard rushing mark. The Bronxville, N.Y., graduate student, whose father was an all-American at Cornell 40 years ago, finished his career with 1,755 yards, the third-highest total in the school's history.

For the second week in a row, Cornell's second-half surge was directed by its sophomore quarterback, Mike Ryan, who came off the bench to march the Big Red 61 yards in eight plays before Holland went over from the 1 to make it 17-14 early in the third period.

Holland added two more 1-yard runs in the fourth quarter to finish with 16 touchdowns for the season.

Holland's first touchdown, a 10-yard effort, tied it at 7-all.

The victory improved Cornell's season record to 5-3-1, the school's best effort and first winning season since 1972. Pennsylvania, loser of five of its last six games, finished at 2-6-1.

In the first half, Brown barely missed scoring as time ran out, the Columbia defense stiffening on the 1-yard line. It was the third Brown threat thwarted by the Lions, who were outclassed in every department in the half.
