

Cornell Beaten, 32-25, by Brown

ITHACA, N.Y., Oct. 18 (AP) — Brown took advantage of three straight Cornell turnovers to score 20 points in the last five minutes of the first half and went on to beat the Big Red, 32-25, today in an Ivy League game.

The Bruins (3-2 over all and 2-1 in league play) erased a 10-6 Cornell lead in the second quarter on scores by Steve Curtin, Rick Vilella and Steve Jordan. Curtin's 1-yard run gave Brown the lead for good at 12-6. Cornell's second-string quarterback, Doug Fusco, fumbled on the next series at the Cornell 17, Brown recovered and Vilella scored on a 2-yard run.

On the next series, John Woodring intercepted at the Cornell 27, setting up Jordan's 14-yard reception from Larry Carbone.

Brown scored again in the third quarter on a 6-yard pass from Carbone to Mitch Metz before Cornell (1-4 and 1-2) surged back behind the passing of Mike Ryan. Ryan, who left in the second quarter with an injury, threw a 13-yard scoring pass to Paul Goodberlet. He then set up a 1-yard run by Steve Vago with 12 minutes left.

Curtin had 187 yards rushing on 24 carries.

Princeton 14, Colgate 10

PRINCETON, N.J., Oct. 18 (AP) — Mark Lockenmeyer hit Mike Neary with a 6-yard touchdown pass with six seconds left today to give Princeton a

14-10 victory over Colgate.

Just a minute earlier, the Colgate place-kicker, Brian Byrne, had booted a 27-yard field goal to give Colgate a 10-7 lead. But the Tigers drove 79 yards in 1 minute 21 seconds for the winning score.

Neary scored Princeton's first touchdown with 11:45 to play, capping a five-play, 71-yard drive. Colgate's touchdown came midway through the third quarter, when Tom McChesney ran off tackle from the 1-yard line.

The Red Raiders rushed for 207 yards in the first half. However, three Princeton interceptions and two bad snaps on field-goal attempts kept the game scoreless at halftime.

McChesney led Colgate (2-3-1) with 141 yards on 23 carries. Chris Crissy of Princeton (2-3) was held to three receptions and 40 yards. Crissy was the leading receiver in college football going into the game.

Lafayette 3, Penn 0

EASTON, Pa., Oct. 18 (UPI) — Bob Bartnett, a senior, kicked a 22-yard field goal at 8:31 of the third period today to give Lafayette a 3-0 victory over Penn in a game dominated by defense.

Mark Lechmanik completed four of six passes and threw for 44 yards in the third-quarter scoring drive. Lafayette settled for the field goal after the Penn

defense shut down the Leopards (2-4) at the 4-yard line.

Penn (1-5) took over the ball at its 46 on an onside kick, and Doug Marzoni directed the offense to the Lafayette 5-yard line in 11 plays. But the Leopards held off the Quakers on three scoring attempts from a yard out.

Penn's final bid in the fourth quarter was blunted by an interception by Joseph Skladany. Steve Boyanoski later in the period had an interception.

Florida St. 41, Boston College 7

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Oct. 18 (AP) — Ron Hester blocked two punts, one for a touchdown, and Ricky Williams ran for 109 yards tonight as Florida State recorded a 41-7 victory over Boston College.

Bill Capece kicked four field goals, running his season total to 18 and bettering the F.S.U. record of 14 in a single campaign.

Duke 34, Clemson 17

CLEMSON, S.C., Oct. 18 (AP) — Ben Bennett, the Duke quarterback, caught a 13-yard touchdown pass from Mike Grayson, a halfback, and Dennis Tabor returned an interception 87 yards to score as the Blue Devils upset Clemson, 34-17, in the Atlantic Coast Conference for their first victory of the season.
